City Code of Ordinance

Sec. 22-25. City's equipment on customer's premises.

- (a) All equipment supplied by the city shall remain its exclusive property and the city shall have the right to remove the same from the premises of a customer at any time after termination of service from whatever cause.
- (b) The customer shall be responsible for the protection and safekeeping of the equipment and facilities of the city while on such customer's premises and shall not permit access thereto except by duly authorized representatives of the city.
- (c) The customer shall pay the city for any repairs to, or any loss of the city's property located on the customer's premises when such repairs or loss are occasioned by negligence on the part of the customer, or by his failure to comply with the terms and conditions under which service is furnished.
- (d) If the city's service wires, meters, or other equipment on a customer's premises, or any other equipment used in rendering service, are tampered with, the customer shall be required to bear all costs incurred by the city for investigations and inspection, and for the installation of such protection as may be necessary in the judgment of the city. Furthermore, where tampering has resulted in improper measurement of the energy supplied, the customer shall be required to pay for such electrical energy as the city may estimate, from available information, to have been used but not registered by the city's meter or meters.
- (e) Properly identified and authorized representatives of the city shall have full and free access to a customer's premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading meters, inspection and repairs, removal of the city's property or for any purpose incident to the supply and discontinuance of electrical energy.
